HAWKS LOOK POISED TO RUN AWAY WITH BIG 12 TITLE.

Things just got a lot less interesting Monday night after KU's convincing 89-76 win over legitimate rival Iowa State.

That win boosts KU's record to 8-1 in the Big 12, two games up on West Virginia and the Cyclones in the win column. The conference schedule is only half over, but it looks like Kansas' "worst team in 10 years" – yes, I actually heard someone say that – is in great position to not only win their 11th straight Big 12 title but to run away and hide with it.

There are nine games left, five on the road. One of those will be played at Texas Tech. Texas Tech is in Lubbock, a place where I spent a month one weekend. There's no reason in the world why KU shouldn't win by two touchdowns.

Another will be the annual rent collection at Allen Field House West which coincides with the one game all year where there aren't a couple thousand Wildcat fans dressed as empty seats.

The other three road games are at Stillwater, Morgantown and Norman.

KU won't do any worse than 3-2 on the road. Oklahoma is a very tough match-up for KU, and Lon Kruger can make chicken dumplings out of chicken droppings. West Virginia's style of play borders on something that should get you 30 days in the Shawnee County lockup. Be that as it may, Bob Huggins has his Mountaineers winning, and Morgantown is a rough place to play.

Don't get me wrong: I wouldn't be surprised to see the Jayhawks win both of these games. If they lose either or both, however, you won't find me on any window ledges. It's the road in the Big 12. Losses happen.

KU will play Baylor, Texas Christian, Texas and West Virginia in The Phog. Scott Drew may get Baylor close to a win, but history tells us he'll find a way to snatch defeat from the jaws of victory. West Virginia could sneak out a win, but no sane person bets against KU in the friendly confines.

Let's say the Fighting Huggies do get the rare win in Allen Field House. That still means Kansas finishes 14-4, and the Jayhawks will win conference title number 11. That's a staggering achievement, one best left for another newsletter.
