SPOILED ROTTEN.

Two things occurred to me this morning as I dragged my tired carcass out of bed. I'd stayed up the night before to watch Kansas' highly improbably comeback against West Virginia.

The first was, "Remember when you could go to the game, scream your brains out, stick around to watch the nets come down and go out for a beer or two or 12 with your buddies? And still make an 8:30 class?"

The second was, "I can't believe how spoiled we – Kansas Basketball fans – are." And I've got numbers to back it up.

- Allen Field House's 227th consecutive sell-out crowd got to see Kansas claim outright their 11th straight conference title. Only UCLA under the legendary John Wooden has won more conference titles in a row.
- KU has won 24 games this season, 13 in the Big 12. It's the 10th straight season they're reached those victory thresholds.
- Kansas is 15-0 in the friendly confines this season and the only Big 12 team not to lose a conference home game.

• KU has not been beaten twice by a league opponent in regular season play since Self came to Kansas.

Now, consider that all this wonderfulness continued under less-than-ideal circumstances.

The Jayhawks were without the services of Big 12 Player of the Year candidate Perry Ellis. A sprained knee kept him on the bench in the second half. Wayne Selden came down on someone's foot midway through the second half and was hobbled the rest of the evening. Cliff Alexander sat on the bench in street clothes, all lawyered up.

They played lackadaisical defense the first half on the way to giving up 40 points. Of course, defense – something Bill Self (and Eddie Sutton and Mr. Iba) hangs his hat on – has been sporadic all season.

And now, apparently, the country's best three-point shooting team can't hit water if they fall out of a boat. Kansas was 0-for-15 from behind the arc against the Mountaineers. KU is shooting 15 percent going back to the TCU game.

Of course, good teams find a way to get it done. KU couldn't buy a basket but they got to the rim and the free throw line. And their second half defense was absolutely stifling, giving up just 19 points.

What do all this weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth mean? It means that we've had it awfully good for a very long time.

Even in a rebuilding year, the Kansas Jayhawks are having the kind of season that most other schools – including the one down I-70 from Lawrence -- dream of: 27, 28 wins... a conference title...a two- or three-seed in what seems like their 517th consecutive NCAA Tournament.

I wouldn't bet the farm on this team to make a deep tournament run. They've got too many deficiencies that can be easily exploited by a good team in the tournament setting.

Don't forget, though, that this has been one of the most athletic, entertaining Kansas Basketball teams we've ever seen. And if a few guys stick around one more year, the Kansas Jayhawks will be loaded for bear (and wildcat and mountaineer and sooner) next season.

This team and this season may not be perfect, but it's still really, really, really good.
